

GRAND CENTRAL TOOWOOMBA STAGE 2 OPENING

National tier-one construction company Probuild is proud to announce the completion of stage 2 of the Grand Central Toowoomba redevelopment. The \$500 million redevelopment doubles Grand Central Toowoomba's size to approximately 90,000m².

Key Points

- This exciting redevelopment scheduled to be complete later this year will transform Grand Central into a landmark urban destination incorporating entertainment, leisure and retail.
- An estimated 1,500 jobs have been created during the construction phase. This included employing 50 local apprentices as a Probuild initiative.
- The redevelopment features Kmart, Big W and Woolworths and up to another 160 speciality retailers. These retailers join Myer, Target and Coles to create a convenient one-stop location for locals.
- This project establishes a strong relationship between Probuild and QIC.

Key construction details

- Natural materials, including timber, stone and brick have been used to reflect the Toowoomba region.
- Frameless glass railings with blackbutt handrails have been incorporated to maximise views of shopfronts, ceilings and the sky.
- Project construction spanned across two public streets, a train line and a creek.
- The construction phase involved two years of permanent night shift.
